

Consider 3 factors in determination of whether student can be educated in general ed classroom

The oft-cited case *Oberti v. Board of Education of the Borough of Clementon School District*, 19 IDELR 908 (3d Cir. 1993), poses three factors districts should consider when determining if a student with a disability can be educated in the general education setting, said Robin Ballard, a school attorney with Schenck, Price, Smith & King, LLP in Florham Park, N.J.:

- 1. Whether the district has made reasonable efforts to accommodate the student in the general education classroom.
- 2. The educational benefits available to the student in the general education classroom with the use of appropriate supplementary aids and services.
- 3. Possible negative effects of the student's inclusion on other students in the class.
